ARTICLE 1:

To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ARTICLE 2:

To choose by ballot: TWO Selectmen for three year terms, TWO Assessor, for three year terms, ONE Assessor, for two year terms. TWO Bethel School Board Directors for three year terms, ONE Greenwood School Director for a three year term, ONE Newry School Director for a three year term, and ONE Woodstock School Director for a three year term.
